
Framingham! – Next Stop on the Bruce Freeman Rail Trail.

A walking tour led by Ed Kross, Framingham Rep. and Board member of the Bruce Freeman Rail Trail

Tour layout. Start and end. The walking tour will start at the McAuliffe Library, 746 Water St in Framingham. Walking south along the Bruce Freeman Rail Trail Right-of-Way, we will cross the Weston Aqueduct trail, and about a quarter mile along we will reach Frost St. It is a short walk to see where the Hultman Aqueduct, the Weston Aqueduct and the BFRT converge at Edgell Rd. After returning to the McAuliffe Library, we have the option to walk north



along the BFRT RoW towards Sudbury, passing by Garden in the Woods after traversing Landham Brook three times. Soft shoes or sneakers and long pants are recommended.
